USE OF VERBS

Using 'Be' form verbs in present tense.

Verb is a doing or being word. It tells something about a person/animal/thing. A verb in present tense refers to present time.

'Am, are and is' are present forms of 'Be' form verb.

- a) 'Am' is used with first person singular; that is 'I'.
- b) 'Are' is used with second person and plurals; that is 'You' and other plurals we and they.
- c) is used with third person singulars; that is 'He', 'She', and 'It'.
